Thomas Clark (1775-1859) spent virtually his whole life in Canterbury. He was the best known of the later West Gallery composers. Like many such, he was initially an amateur musician. His day job was that of boot and shoe maker, though towards the latter part of his life he turned increasingly to church music. He composed the well known setting "Cranbrook", which although published as a sacred setting eventually became associated with the secular text "On Ilkley Moor Baht 'At". The present setting was published in "A Fourth Set of Psalm and Hymn Tunes" (London, 1808).
